

The Cayuga Lake Scenic Byway Geotrail

The Cayuga Lake Scenic Byway (CLSB) Geotrail encourages participants to get outside and experience the scenic, natural, historic and cultural resources of the Cayuga Lake Scenic Byway. The trail is divided into two regions with 10 caches located within each region. Geocachers finding at least 15 official CLSB Geotrail caches in each region can redeem this passport for a free commemorative Geotrail coin. 500 commemorative coins have been produced and are available while supplies last.

Each cache contains a numbered hole punch which corresponds to a numbered space in the punch strip for each region. Once you have punched at least 15 spaces bring your passport to one of the following sites to pick up your free collectable geocoin.

Carved by glaciers, Cayuga Lake is the longest and second deepest of the Finger Lakes, at 38.2 miles long and 435 feet deep at its deepest point. It reaches 53 feet below sea level, and along with Seneca Lake, it is among the deepest lakes in North America.
